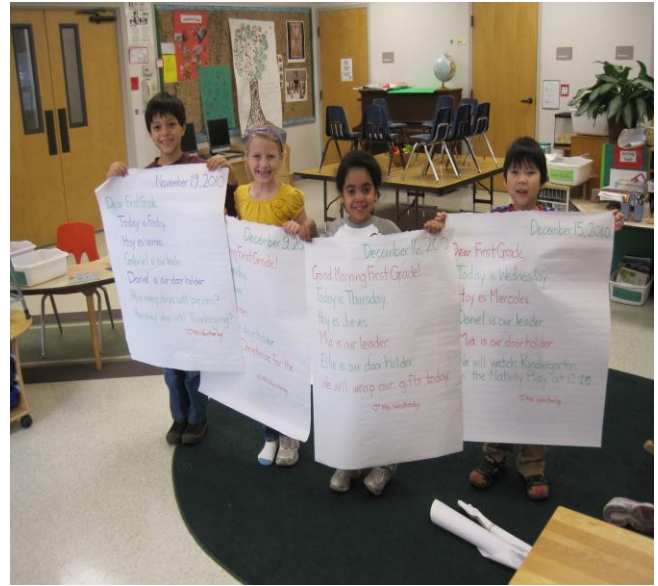


Do you recognize this artist?
